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Who To Call

-Contact your child's teacher to discuss academic progress, ask questions about school, or talk about difficulties your child may be having.

Know the Lingo

Evacuations are used to avoid the threat of potential internal hazards, such as fire, fumes or unexplained alarms.

Modified Lockdown is a modification of a full lockdown based on more information and situational awareness. It is initiated to isolate students and staff inside the school from potential dangers outside the school. Daily activities usually continue, however there is restricted access both in and out of the buildings.

Shelter in Place provides protection from potential environmental risks occurring outdoors.

Lockdown is an established response plan implemented by a school or other workplace building which is put into effect once there is a perceived or actual threat from an external or internal source. There is no access in or out.

What Parents Should Know



WRSD is Ready

Emergencies are rarely expected - but White River is always prepared!

All schools have a crisis plan

Training and frequent drills allow quick response to emergencies, whether man-made or natural, to safeguard students, staff and visitors. Measures are in place to assist those with special needs.

Parents and guardians can feel confident that we work closely with police, fire, and other emergency authorities to ensure the safety of your child.

Talk to your child

Remind your child to follow instructions for their own safety. Reassure them that principals and teachers have been trained and know what to do.

When Something Happens...

Official WRSD news sources will share information and updates as quickly as possible. Avoid rumors and speculation; they cause undue concern. Remember students and others may not have accurate information:

- Stay Calm! Remember, most emergency actions are precautionary
- Monitor your school website (whiteriver.wednet.edu) and social media sites
- Check your email and text messages for urgent communication

School is often the safest place for students. WRSD works with emergency officials to ensure that students are safe inside their schools.

Avoid calling or visiting schools, unless instructed. Do not inadvertently interfere with emergency response crews. Let them do their jobs and wait until we can safely release students to you.
